#### REPORT BY GROUP MANAGER CORPORATE PLANNING & COMMUNICATIONS

#### **Summary**

Council received a submission on the final day of the public exhibition of the draft Operational Plan and Budget 2021-2022. The timing of this submission occurred after finalisation of the business paper for the ordinary meeting of Council in June 2021. It is the second of two public submissions and is now being brought to the attention of Council for consideration in conjunction with consideration of Council Report 39/21.

#### **Operational Plan Objective**

- 2.1 Community confidence in Council's decision making
- 2.1.3 Ensure transparency and accountability in decision making

#### **Background**

This submission was received after the Council Report (ITEM 39/21) Adoption of Operational Plan and Budget 2021-2022, Statement of Revenue Policy and Schedule of Fees and Charges for 2021-2022 was finalised for publication. That report indicated that any submissions received after Monday 21 June 2021 would be presented separately to the Council Meeting of 29 June 2021.

The actions are far reaching and there needs to be proper financial modelling and responsible prioritising before the actions can be fully implemented as suggested. Staff have already completed the two-day Designing for Pedestrians and Bicycle Riders course and have utilised the principles and lessons learnt for the design of Council's existing cycleway network.  An LGA wide cycleway has already been implemented however does not extend to all schools. This will be included in the upcoming Active Transport Plan and Pedestrian Access and Mobility Plan.  In the last two years Council has been rolling out the Mayor's 1000 Trees Program, aimed at providing additional canopy cover as well as improving the amenity of our streets. An additional 90-100 trees will be planted in Wangal Park, and at a large number of intersections and key streets, hard surfaces have been replaced with soft landscaping and planting. A rolling program of landscaping and tree planting will be continue in the coming years.  Council will review budget breakdown methods.
