Under the new PID Act, Council is required to have in place a Public Interest Disclosures Policy by 1 October 2023. The NSW Ombudsman's Office have confirmed that an agency that has a draft policy on public exhibition at that time will be considered to have complied with that requirement. The purpose of this report is to seek endorsement of a draft policy for public exhibition.
